Born in Tehran, Iran, in 1981, **Tala Madani** is one of the most engaging painters of her generation. Madani's work is characterised by loose expressive brushwork rendered in a bold, distinctive palette. After receiving her MFA from Yale University School of Art in 2006, Madani made her solo debut in 2007. Recent solo exhibitions include: Tala Madani, La Panacée, Montpellier (2017); Shitty Disco, Pilar Corrias Gallery, London (2016). Tala Madani lives and works in Los Angeles. Madani was awarded the Catherine Doctorow Prize for Contemporary Painting (2013), the De Volkskrant Art Award (2012), shortlisted for the Future Generation Art Prize, Pinchuk Art Centre (2012), the Van den Berch van Heemstede Stichting Fellowship (2008), and the Kees Verwey Fellowship (2007). residence at the British School of Rome (2010), and The Rijksakademie van beeldende kunsten, Amsterdam (2007).
