Material

- o **Purple** Crayons
- o Mirrors





What is a self-portrait?

• A self-portrait is an image or representation of an artist created by the artist themselves, typically through painting, drawing, photography, etc.

What is a guide animal?

- A guide animal is an animal you connect with. It is an animal you would want to be if it were possible to be an animal.
 - o If you were an animal, what animal would you want to be? Why do you want to be this animal?
 - What characteristics does the animal have that you like? Do you have these same characteristics?
 - Do you look like this animal?

Using a mirror or a photograph of yourself as a reference point:

- Start by drawing your eye. Then draw the animal's eye. Is it bigger? Smaller? The same shape or different? The same color or different?
- Now draw your nose, then draw the animal's nose. They don't need to connect perfectly. Does the animal have whiskers? Are there freckles on either of your faces?
- Next draw the lips, shape of the face, and hair, etc.

Share your drawing with someone and tell the story of why you selected that animal and how its identity traits align with you.
